**AD-HOC SUGGESTED BY-LAWS/GUIDELINES FOR DISTRICT 01, JULY 2009**  
**AD-HOC COMMITTEE: MARTY C. (chairperson), JOHN S., BRUCE K., BETSY N., DANIEL T.**

**Mission Statement** – The mission of District 01 is to provide information for the AA community in the Green Bay Area in an effort to continue to carry the AA message to the still suffering alcoholic. This mission will be accomplished through the teamwork of chair people in the following areas:

- 1) A monthly newsletter about events and meetings in the Green Bay area.
- 2) Communication with the professional community including, but not limited to doctors, AA counselors, and treatment facilities.
- 3) A program called “Bridging the Gap” which assists AA members being released from correction and treatment facilities.
- 4) A website dedicated to providing online information for the AA community.
- 5) The placement of AA literature at treatment facilities throughout the Green Bay area.
- 6) The advancement of the Grapevine monthly AA magazine.

The district team will meet monthly to assure that the mission of AA District 01 is being carried out properly.

The team will work in conjunction with Area 74 and the GSO in New York to assure that the goals of AA throughout the world are being adhered to.

- a.) Responsibility Statement – “I am responsible. When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of AA always to be there; and for that, I am responsible.
- b.) Diagram of Group service structure – see Attachment 1
- c.) Diagram of Fellowship service structure – see Attachment 2

**District 01 Meeting:**

- a. The District 01 Meeting will be held on the third Thursday of each month at 6:30 PM at the Bridge, with the exception of every other September, when the District Meeting will take place at the District Picnic in conjunction with District Elections.
- b. All AA members are welcomed at all District Meetings to observe. Non-voting members will be allowed to share before and/or after business has been conducted (three min. per member).
- c. The business portion of District 01 service meetings will be conducted by an “informal” application of “Robert’s Rules of Order”.
- d. Voting members of District 01 are GSR’s, District Officers and Standing Committee Chairs.
- e. Motions at District Meetings must be in writing by a group (via GSR), District Officer, Standing Committee Chair or AA member, and seconded by a present GSR, District Officer, or Standing Committee Chair before it can come to a vote.

**District 01 Election:**

- a. Any AA group or member can nominate any qualified AA member for a District Office or Standing Committee Chair. Alternates for District Committee Member (DCM), District Secretary and District Treasurer may be nominated.
- b. District 01 Elections will take place every other year at the District Picnic.
- c. Suggested sobriety time for District Officers and Standing Committee Chairs is two years.
- d. Any AA member who attends the elections at the District Picnic will have a vote. Elections will be decided by majority votes.

**District officers and Standing Committee Chairpersons**

**District Committee Member (DCM):** The DCM is the link between the AA groups (GSR’s) and the Area. They attend and chair all District Meetings. They attend all Area Assemblies, Delegates workshops and DCM Meetings. The DCM reports regularly at District Meetings.

**Alternate District Committee Member:** Assists and works with the DCM. Carries out DCM’s vote and responsibilities in the DCM’s absence. Learns all DCM’s responsibilities.

**Secretary:** Records and Transcribes all minutes from District Meetings. Keeps and maintains all District Records. Works closely with Newsletter Chairperson. Maintains roster of Meetings, GSR’s, Alt. GSR’s, and District Officers and Standing Committee Chairs. Reports regularly at District Meetings.

**Treasurer:** Keeps all financial records for the District and reports regularly at District Meetings. Collects group and individual donations and maintains records. Maintains bank account and checkbook, and issues checks for District expenses.

**Archives Chairperson:** Keeps and maintains oral and written historical records for District 01. Makes regular reports at District Meetings.

**Corrections Chairperson:** Coordinates and recruits volunteers for jail and correctional facilities AA Meetings. Acquires and distributes literature and Big Books for jail and correctional facilities Meetings. Reports regularly at District Meetings.

**Grapevine Chairperson:** Keeps District and groups informed about the Grapevine (our meeting in print). Keeps informed of changes, subscription price, etc. Reports regularly at District Meetings.

**Newsletter Chairperson:** Obtains group names, times, locations, type of meeting and contact phone numbers for Meeting List to be published and updated monthly in the District Newsletter. Obtains information from the District Secretary (minutes), group special events, Central Office, and District for monthly publication. Edits, compiles, prints and distributes monthly newsletter. Reports regularly at District Meetings.

**Public Information Chairperson:** Keeps the general public informed of the function of AA in the community (schools, hospitals, churches, etc.). Provides literature and Meeting List to the public. Fields questions and phone calls from the community about AA. Reports regularly at District Meetings.

**Website Chairperson:** Maintains District 01 Web Page. Applies any changes of Web Page information and updates regularly. Reports regularly at the District Meetings.

**Bridging the Gap/Treatment Chairperson:** Assists people coming from jail, correctional facilities and treatment who are transitioning into the general public. Provides liaisons for people to feel welcomed into the AA community. Provides phone numbers and meeting information to people coming out of institutions. Provides communication from other alcoholics (i.e. letters, phone calls, etc.) while in institutions. Reports regularly at District Meetings.

**District Events Chairperson:** Plans, coordinates and recruits volunteers for all District Events (i.e. District Picnic, Meet and Eat, etc.). Reports regularly at District Meetings.

**Cooperation with the Professional Community Chairperson:** Maintains communication about AA with the court system, police, judges, lawyers, doctors, probation and parole, etc. regarding the function of AA in the community. Provides literature and information to the professional community. Reports regularly at District Meetings.

#### **Responsibilities of Standing Committee Chairs**

District Officers and Standing Committee Chairpersons will submit a budget annually for expenses (travel, literature, printing cost, etc.).

At the start of their term, Standing Committee Chairpersons will be responsible for recruiting and forming their own committees, to be made up of GSR's and other AA members.

Standing Committee chairs will be required to make a mandatory quarterly report to the District in the months of January, April, July, and October.

#### **Groups**

a.) Groups will elect their own Officers and Standing Committee Representatives.

b.) New GSR forms should be submitted to the District Session in January, or when instated as GSR for group.
