CENTRAL OFFICE HANDLING HOTLINE

At 10:00am on May 1, 2009, the new system for handling AA hotline calls will take effect. No more need for an answering service at a cost of \$3000.00 per year. All calls will be made to and thru the Central Office phone system. During office hours, office staffers will answer the calls. When the office is closed, calls will be forwarded to the phones of AA groups members who volunteered to handle this service.

The first six AA groups to step forward are getting the program started and we have other groups waiting in the wings. Frankly, the response from the groups was outstanding. We invited groups and they didn't even hesitate. The answer was yes. We had three groups contact us wanting to participate. They came to us. Once the word got out, we didn't even have to ask. Now that is called "carrying the message."

The system involves a group taking a day each week to handle incoming calls. Hours are from 5:00 pm on Monday thru Friday until 10:00 am the next morning. The Saturday shift is from 2:00pm on Saturday until 10:00am on the following Monday. Groups are requested to commit to a 6 month schedule.

Each group has a hotline coordinator who organizes the volunteers and forwards the group's monthly schedule to the Central Office. The vast majority of calls to the hotline number are from people looking for meeting times, locations and directions. People looking for help with their alcoholism problems will be asked for their first names and phone numbers. Volunteers who answer their call will then contact our list of AA members who handle such inquiries. These will be the same members who have been handling these calls thru the old answering service. They are well experienced.

Members who answer the phone need to have at least 6 months minimum sobriety. The members who actually discuss alcoholism with callers need to have at least 2 years minimum sobriety.
