Minutes of the GSR and Committee Service Meeting @ The Bridge

May 21, 2009

The meeting opened with prayer and the Responsibility Statement.

Area Announcements were read.
Communications were passed down to District GSR's.

Old Business- Responses to the District questionnaire were discussed. There seems to be a lack of communication between the Groups and the District. This needs to be rectified and also DCM John would like to get some by-laws in place before the next change of leadership. Chairpersons are to form committees and report back to the District with what we can do for the Groups. Recommendation was made for an Adhoc Committee to oversee this endeavor. Motion seconded and passed by majority. Red Road Group GSR Marty will head the Adhoc committee, DCM John R.S. will sit on the committee and Betsy is interested in participating. **GSR's are encouraged to ask if anyone in their groups would like to be on this committee. Contact Marty at 920-559-7887 if you are interested. Help us all to help the alcoholic who still suffers. I (we) all are responsible.**

New Business- Phyllis reported on progress for planning the District picnic (Events Chair). September 15th after St. Matt's picnic? Areas for the event were discussed.

CPC- Alan talked with someone interested in working with him on his committee. Professional qualifications with AODA.

Bridging the Gap- Still needs volunteers to write to those incarcerated about release. Keeping up okay.

Public Info.- Elizabeth and volunteers keeping up in spite of medical problems. Will hang in there. Good Job!!!!

Hotline- Jim reported that things are going well, but the chair probably should be removed from District chairs. Initial problems (static & forwarding) were corrected easily and now going well at the Central Office. Motion to remove chair from District structure seconded and approved.

Newsletter- Add District E-mails as developed.

Results of Survey:

- Does your group understand the District's role in serving the groups?
52% are unsure if they understand or not; 44% know the district role.
- Have the District chairs (not central office) been any assistance to your Groups?
69% do not know if the district has been help or not; 27% believe they have been of assistance.
- Can your group afford to send \$100 each quarter to the District?
64% do not know if their group can afford it;
25% are sure their group cannot.
- Do you know who the GSR is for your group and their duties?
82% know who their GSR is.
- Do you know why and how the money from your group is distributed?
84% know where their money goes.
- Are you aware that the District 01 Committee is separate from the Central Office?
88% are aware of the separation of Central Office and District 01.
- Does your group have a GSR and do they attend District Committee meetings?
84% know their group has a GSR and that they attend meetings.
- Does your group contribute 7th Tradition money to the GSO, District and area?
68% are aware their meeting contributes; 28% don't know.
- Would your group like help from the District?
72% don't know if their group would like help or not;
20% would like their group to gain help from the District.
- Does your group know the name of the District Chairman?
46% don't know if they know or not, 29% don't know,
25% do know.
- Is your group satisfied with the District's actions?
60% are not sure if they are satisfied or not; 29% are satisfied.
- Would you like better communication between the groups and District?
77% would like better communication with the District.
- Does your group know the District has a Post Office Box to send contributions?
52% know the P.O. Box; 48% don't know either way.
- Would you like E-mail addresses published in the newsletter?
63% would like addresses published; 37% don't want or don't know about E-mail addresses.
- If you knew you could volunteer for service work at the District level, would you?
54% wouldn't volunteer, 45% would.

What is Back to Basics? Back to Basics is a 4-week program to complete all 12 Steps of AA in four 1-hour sessions. This program was devised in the 1940's when AA enjoyed a 50-75% success rate. Only the Back to Basics text and the Big Book are used.

We have gone from "Rarely have we seen a person fail" to "Seldom have we seen a person recover." Bob P. General Manager, AA General Service Office, NY states, "Sobriety – freedom from alcohol – through the teaching of the 12 Steps is the sole purpose of an AA group. Groups have repeatedly tried other activities, and they have always failed." Tens of thousands of AA's found the spiritual solution to alcoholism by taking the 12 Steps in these beginners' meetings. They completed the Steps in about a month. Then in order to ensure their sobriety, they helped others through the recovery process.

We are offering these meetings in Green Bay. **Meetings are open to all from newcomers to old timers.
